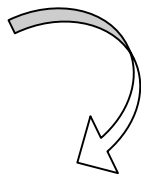

2010-2011 Calvary Goals Update

*The following goals were put in place for June 2010 – May 2011
Below are some highlights.*

- Reoriented our sanctuary to enhance our worship experience with focus on the altar, with our stain-glass windows providing a reflective background.
- Vestry sought advice from parishioners about several topics through surveys and/or informal contacts and conversations.

Encourage the congregation's understanding and participation in Calvary's team ministries

- A team leader training was held in May 2010
- Announcements were made by Vestry members to raise ministry visibility
- Finance Team was re-activated
- A new "Finesse" Team was created and supported the work for the Sanctuary reorientation
- Property team was well organized and active, with project lists posted in the Parish Hall

Implement improved plan to welcome and retain members

- Welcome team leaders were identified
- Air conditioning and Parish Hall door installed to provide comfort and security for all who come to Calvary.
- Vestry members "checked in" periodically with people in households in our parish directory.

Increase visibility in the community: "Put Calvary on the Map"

- Updated our Church website, added Facebook and Twitter pages
- Re-established a relationship with three greater Hunterdon area newspapers to publish Calvary's news items with greater frequency
- Held the 2010 Outreach Day in October with great success
- Continued support of the Greater Flemington Area Food Bank

9. 2009 Treasurer's Report
Summary: Income over budget by approximately \$2000, where pledge was under budget and other income made up the difference. Expense was right on budget. We paid the pledged 2.5% Diocesan commitment. On the balance sheet the investments were up 20% with the market.
Report was accepted as filed by title in the motion in item 8
10. 2010 Objectives
 - a) Continuation of Goals 2009-2010
 - b) Next step: God's vision, needs for growth and space
 - c) Vestry voted that if consulting services would be necessary during this process, then Fr. Frank Hubbard would be retained. Vestry also voted to establish a Growth Fund. We need to identify our needs and where our current space works and does not work. We want to get input from as many in the Parish in small group format as possible.

d.) Sabbatical for Rector

2010 will be Father Harry's first sabbatical. A sabbatical had been recommended to him at the CREDO conference and endorsed by Bishop Councell and the Vestry. Plans are still coming together but the outline is from August to October 2010 to travel to our companion Diocese in Ecuador. In the interim Mother Anne will increase her hours and the remaining time will be filled in by supply priests.

Question (Tom Kinnamon): will supply priests be used and if so, what is the total impact on the 2010 budget?

Answer: yes, supply priests will be used. We do not have the number of the impact on the budget separated out. Bob Griswold will get the number to the Parish Update (Bob Griswold, Feb. 8, 2010): "I just reviewed the details of the 2010 budget. We allocated throughout the 2010 budget - 7,000 for Fr. Harry's sabbatical. This is the increase that can be seen in Mother Ann's salary, for Supply Priest and Continuing education account. \$7,000 is 3.3% of 2010 Budget."

11. **2010 Budget**

Summary: Budget is balanced. The Diocesan Commitment will be increased to 3%. Includes expenses for Father Harry's sabbatical. All 2009 budget cuts are restored – mostly in salary and hours. On the Income side, the budget is looking for more fund raising activity – increased by \$8000. On the expense side; expenses included salary increase, restored hours, and sabbatical.

Question (Tom Kinnamon): with regard to the \$2500 "carryover," aren't we fooling ourselves? Isn't this a deficit?

Answer: It is additional money that was collected in 2009, over-budget income.

Comment (John Banger): There is nothing in long-term maintenance budgeted for last year or this coming year. This is not a good situation. Ideally we need money in that fund.

Comment (?): at the last parish that I attended, they had a separate blue envelope every week in addition to the regular envelope that was for long-term maintenance giving. No pressure to give every week, but it was there as a reminder.

Comment (Fr. Harry): We have extra envelopes in the back of everyone's packets that could be used like that.

Question (Emilie Nawrock): Is Father Hubbard's services being paid for?

Answer: No not at this time.

Question (Mike ?): In summer, we should move from three services to two since attendance is so much lower, that way we could save some money.

11. **Old Business**

a. Review of the nomination process and the proposed ballot prior to the annual meeting.

Asked for nominations from Parish two months in advance of the meeting. Posted photos and bios on the wall in the Parish Hall.

Question (Emilie Nawrock): Can there be a sign that says Vestry Nominations instead of Welcome to Calvary. I did not know that they were the Vestry nominations.

Comment (?): We need younger members of the church to step up and help out with things like Altar Guild. It is desperate, there are so few and the average age is really getting up there and we are scheduled every two weeks.

Comment (Emilie Nawrock): Also Chalice administrators are needed, too.

b. Use the Book of Common Prayer at worship

It is available in the pews for use and the pages that are used are now listed in the bulletin. Feb. 27 Mother Ann will have a seminar on using the Book of Common Prayer.

c. Monthly review of Ministry Areas

At services in the beginning of the year we had overviews, this will resume. Vestry is now making announcements at services, too.

d. Reformat of the Annual Meeting

Separated the Annual Meeting into two Sundays; the Vestry's Service Recognition Brunch to celebrate and discuss the ministry area reports, and then the Annual Meeting Sunday to discuss budget and voting.

12. New Business

Comment (Beth Mahoney) – It would be nice to have some sort of literature about all of the ministry areas, telling us what is available, what sort of work is required, what is the commitment of time, etc.

Question (?) - Is a Parish Photo Directory on hold indefinitely? A. No not exactly, but needs to be revived.

Question (?) - A paper directory, can we have one? A. Yes, will email it out on Monday, Feb. 1, 2010

Comment (?) - The care and warmth of the Calvary family is a blessing.

Rector's Annual Report – January, 2011

Dear Calvary Parishioners,

We had a wonderful year as our leadership and people stepped up to the plate to continue our ministries. Parish life continued while I was on sabbatical. I was so happy to hear from Mother Ann and our Wardens, about how the teams worked together to carry out the day-to-day ministry. I was thrilled to hear that even new things happened while I was away: from the Sunset Supper Program for children in the summer to the surprise of the new carpet in the sanctuary and air-conditioning in the Parish Hall .

Thank you, *gracias*, for sabbatical time! The experience was wonderful. Many of you have seen the pictures of my time in Ecuador. I left on July 19th, had over three weeks of immersion Spanish, met people in the Diocese of Ecuador Central, visited in the country. Most of my time was spent in Quito, where I stayed with Susana & Ángel Oleas, relatives of our parishioners, the Muñoz family. There was considerable savings on lodging and meal expenses due to the generosity of Susana & Ángel. **I'm thrilled that our Vestry sent a thank offering of \$1000 to the Cristo Liberador parish, and the Portal del Belén nursery school it operates. Our gift was used to create a safe, secure outdoor play area for the children.** We have the pictures! When I returned to the USA, I had six weeks for rest and reflection before returning to Calvary in November.

Perhaps the greatest visual change at Calvary was the reorientation of our worship space. I want to thank our Vestry and “Finesse Team” for all their work in enhancing the beauty of our sanctuary. Many, many people commented on how beautiful the church looked for Christmas this year. Parishioners even took pictures to show to other people and parishes! Thank you all for your flexibility as we adjust to our new space arrangement.

A special thanks to Mother Ann Holt, for her care of our parish while I was away. Thank you also to Deacon Jack Hain, and our wardens, Karen DeFrancesco and Mirelle White, for their added responsibilities this year, and for our Vestry and all of you who pitched in. Continue the good work in the name of our Lord!

I am excited about taking up my part of the ministry at Calvary – working together to implement our goals during 2011.

May the Holy Spirit guide us as we move joyfully forward with Christ's mission in the Flemington area and beyond!

ASSOCIATE PRIEST'S REPORT - 2010

The Rev. Ann Holt

During this third year as Calvary's Associate, my ministry continued in the areas of Adult Formation, Outreach, Pastoral Care, and Worship.

In Adult Formation, our Tuesdays at Ten group winds its way through the great Old Testament Story, seen mostly through the lives of its women. This year, we continued to meet through the summer, with a slightly different format. We shared a Quiet Day in Lent on a February Saturday, as well as a field trip to the beautiful Icon Exhibit at the Convent of St. John Baptist in May. Carleen Tedeschi, Laura Kasser and I work with the members of the Adult Formation Committee to plan our Sunday Morning Forums and other programs, as outlined in our Report.

In Outreach, several parishioners and I continue our ministry at the Kapp Senior Apartments in Flemington, sharing Holy Communion and a social time with a faithful group of residents there on the first Wednesday of each month. Roxanne Zellin's Baking with a Mission provides delicious refreshments for our time together. In October, seven of these Kapp friends attended Calvary's lovely Evensong service and very much enjoyed it and the Soup Supper afterwards.

Our parish knitters and crocheters have now graced close to 70 people with beautiful prayer shawls, a ministry that seems to have a special life of its own. In November, we also sent a box of scarves and caps off to the Seamen's Institute's Christmas at Sea program, to warm sailors out on the cold seas in the winter.

In Pastoral Care, I continue to enjoy my visits with members unable to attend our worship services, and in Worship, I share preaching and liturgical duties with Father Harry and Deacon Jack.

That's all—except—I almost forgot—July through October, my stint as the designated Priest-in-Charge during Father Harry's sabbatical!!

It was a rich time, a reminder of what it was like when I was at the helm of my own parish, with the additional anxieties of tending someone else's store! In July and August we pared our schedule to two services—7:30 and 9:30—which engendered some good, relaxed visiting among our members. In July, we delighted in the installation of our wonderful Parish Hall Air-Conditioning, enabling us all to enjoy those blistering days in cool comfort. Kathy Wagner and I instituted the Sunset Supper Program for our children, four sessions with a different kind of outreach explored at each. Lots of fun! September and October saw the remarkable Transition Team re-fashioning our Turned-Around Church, as well as all the usual fall activities starting up with a successful bang, the momentum from which carried us into November, and the return of the Mazujians.

What I say now about these four months is what I marveled at over and over again during that time: Calvary is blessed with remarkable lay leadership, and how much I appreciated the work that everyone did during those months. Harry returned to a parish that looked beautiful, inside and out, which carried on its holy work with good grace, skill, hard work, and humor. It was wonderful to work with you—and equally wonderful to hand it back. But I cherish getting to know you all in a deeper way, as well as being entrusted with this very large responsibility in this very special place.

My deep gratitude to each of you for your friendship and support, all through the year!

During the last three years, in addition to our goals, the Vestry has focused on the ministries, teams of people who support all the functions of the church. These are the people who “dress” the church with linens and flowers, set the altar, greet the people, sing the hymns, provide the torch lights and carry the cross, take the offering, clean the chalice, clean the albs, tidy the church after services, provide the fellowship hour, arrange/coordinate, cook, and clean up after the dinners, manage our web page, cut the grass, provide plumbing, electrical, and carpentry services, coordinate and run the FUNdraisers, teach our children, lead a children’s service, provide and coordinate youth group activities, manage the finances, draw up the budget, and provide opportunities to help others such as the Thanksgiving Food Pantry Walk and the Angel Tree. We would also like to thank Father Harry for his ministry and devotion to Calvary Church.

MINISTRY AREA: CHRISTIAN FORMATION: CHILDREN

Name: Kim Webb

How has the good news of Jesus Christ proclaimed through this ministry this year?

- + The teachings of Jesus have been taught by our dedicated Sunday school teachers who have used the “All Things New” curriculum for Pre-K through Grade 6.
- + Communion instruction continues to be taught to our 2nd grade class in addition to their regular Christian Formation studies. The children spend the year studying this central act of worship and the spiritual life which culminates in a dedicated “Instructed Eucharist” ceremony in June.
- + The 7th and 8th grade students receive the Good News of Jesus Christ through reading weekly Bible passages from the Old and New Testament that provide them with important preparation for their Confirmation studies.
- + The 9th – 12th grade students meet every other week for Confirmation Studies and Youth Group Meetings.

Functions included in this area:

- + Children’s Church is offered for ages 3-6 at the 9 & 11a.m. services. Children are led by an adult in a simplified service that has all the components of the adult service in the Church. This provides our young parishioners with an interactive learning experience that prepares them for their own journey of worship.
- + Pre-K through 8th grade attends weekly Christian Formation Classes.
- + 9th – 12th grade attend weekly study/confirmation classes, youth group participation.
- + Easter Basket Outreach- all children are asked to donate candy for baskets delivered to the Flemington Food Pantry.
- + Annual Thanksgiving Food Drive and walk to Flemington Food Pantry in which all classes are asked to donate specific food items to help those less fortunate in our community have a Happy Thanksgiving.
- + Annual Christmas Epiphany Pageant- Chairpersons-Adrienne Hahn/Andrea Lynott
- + Submission of monthly newsletter entry that provides information about upcoming activities and class assignments.

Accomplishments this year:

- + Combining the use of two curriculums to provide extra learning materials for our teachers
- + Children’s Summertime Program run by Fr. Harry, Deacon Jack, Lisa Bruzzio and Michelle Clinger
- + Combined 4th and 5th grade Classes continue due to smaller class sizes and in order to have two teachers per classroom so that helpers can alternate teacher as necessary.
- + Since September’09- Kindergarten through 5th grade classes have two teachers per classroom
- + Since September’09- Reduced cost of Curriculum by making use of prior year’s Teachers Manuals- A savings of approximately \$20/ teacher three times a year.

Objectives for next year:

- + Continue to recruit Parishioners to assist our youth on their lifelong journey of Christian Formation- For the 2010/2011 church school year we have added Kathy Wagner and Nicole Conover.
- + Continue to organize all Curriculum in order to reduce cost of teacher’s manuals for 2011-2012.
- + Review Curriculum with teachers, parents and clergy

MINISTRY AREA: Finance

How has the Good News of Jesus Christ proclaimed through this ministry this year?

We are truly grateful to Calvary members for their generous financial support in 2010. The pledge income projection remained flat at the 2009 figure and we came quite close to achieving it this year, a significant improvement over 2009. Through careful planning and management of expenses we were able to end 2010 with a small surplus. Although we slightly exceeded our budgeted commitment to the Diocese, the fact remains that a large gap still exists between the amount actually paid and our suggested Fair Share.

Functions included in this area:

The finance team is entrusted with managing our financial assets. This includes collecting, accounting, and reporting of pledges and gifts, managing investment funds, paying bills and obligations, providing direction in budget planning, and reporting regularly to the Vestry.

Accomplishments this year:

We finished 2010 with a surplus of \$1900. This was a significant achievement, given an increase in budgeted expenses to accommodate Father Harry's sabbatical. Due to your generous support, we raised funds to purchase air conditioning units for the Parish Hall and many cool hours of fellowship were had by all this summer! We also completed a parish audit for the year 2009 under the leadership of Ray McAlarnen with support from Tom Kinnamon. Thanks to Ray and Tom for the countless hours spent reviewing and documenting their findings/recommendations.

Objectives for next year:

- In terms of income, the good news for 2010 is that actual Pledge and Gift income met our budgeted projection. The bad news is that the total projected income was still less than it was 2 years ago by \$20,000! We need to increase income to do God's work at Calvary – by increasing our Diocesan pledge as well as our financial Outreach efforts for those in need. We cannot do this if we don't increase our income. Fund Raising is a high priority goal for 2011!
- It remains a continuing challenge to find areas to cut expenses. Minimal amounts are included in the 2011 budget for maintenance of the facilities, e.g. window/door replacement and roof repairs. As needs arise, we will need to raise money to fund these projects.
- An area of focus for the Finance Team in 2011 will be implementing the recommendations based on the audit findings.

Questions and Ideas to be explored for the future:

The finance team welcomes all suggestions, particularly for ways to increase our income through fundraisers, increased emphasis on stewardship, etc.

The upkeep of parish buildings and grounds and the Christian fellowship that makes this happen is a visible testimony of Christ at work. The enthusiasm of the property helpers has inspired others, both parishioners and non-parishioners, to offer their help.

Functions included in this area:

6. The Parish Hall roof was recoated with tar and a membrane that we hope will correct the latest problem.
7. Two volunteers from the AA who meet in our Parish Hall offered to remove two large trees at the rear of the parking lot that were over-hanging wires. With some Parishioner help, that work was accomplished along with some much-needed trimming of other trees.
8. The kitchen cabinets were refitted and new hardware was donated and installed.
